1. Which of the following sets S are convex?

a.
$$S = \{(x, y) \in \mathbb{R}^2 : x^2 = y\}$$
 (1 p)

b.
$$S = \{x \in \mathbb{R}^n : \max_i(x_i) \le r\}, \text{ where } r > 0.$$
 (1 p)

c.
$$S = \{(x, t) \in \mathbb{R}^2 : |x|^2 \le t^2\}.$$

d.
$$S = \text{epi}(f)$$
 where $f(x) = e^x$ and $x \in \mathbb{R}$. (1 p)

e.
$$S = \{x \in \mathbb{R}^n : Ax \ge b\}$$
 where $A \in \mathbb{R}^{m \times n}$ and $b \in \mathbb{R}^m$. (1 p)

2. Which of the following functions f are convex? Prove or disprove.

a.
$$f(x) = \begin{cases} x & \text{if } x > 0 \\ -1 & \text{if } x \le 0 \end{cases}$$
 where $x \in \mathbb{R}$. (1 p)

b.
$$f(x) = g^*(x)$$
 where $g(x) = a_4 x^4 + a_3 x^3 + a_2 x^2 + a_1 x^1 + a_0$ where $x \in \mathbb{R}$. (1 p)

$$\mathbf{c.} \ f(x) = \begin{cases} -\min(\log(x), -e^{-x}) & \text{if } x > 0 \\ \infty & \text{if } x \le 0 \end{cases} \text{ where } x \in \mathbb{R}.$$

d.
$$f(x) = |x|^3$$
 where $x \in \mathbb{R}$. (1 p)

$$\mathbf{e.} \ f(x) = \begin{cases} \|x\|_2^2 & \text{if } Ax = b \\ \infty & \text{otherwise} \end{cases} \text{ where } A \in \mathbb{R}^{m \times n} \text{ and } b \in \mathbb{R}^m.$$

3. Compute the proximal operator $\operatorname{prox}_{\gamma f}(x)$ for the Huber loss

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} \frac{1}{2}x^2 & \text{if } |x| \le 1/2\\ \frac{1}{2}(|x| - \frac{1}{4}) & \text{if } |x| > 1/2 \end{cases}$$

where
$$f: \mathbb{R} \to \mathbb{R}$$


4. Compute the subdifferential to the berHu (reversed Huber) loss

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} ||x||_2 & \text{if } ||x||_2 \le 1\\ \frac{1}{2}(||x||_2^2 + 1) & \text{if } ||x||_2 > 1 \end{cases}$$

5. A convex function f has the following properties: f(-2) = 3, $\partial f(-1) = \{-1\}$, $\partial f(0) = [-1,0]$. What can you conclude about the following properties?

6. Sketch the conjugate of the piecewise linear function showed below. Outside the plotted domain, assume the graph continues in the same direction as on the boundary. (1 p)



- 7. Consider the functions $g(x) = \gamma f(x)$ and h(x) = f(x-b) where $\gamma > 0$.
 - **a.** Find g^* expressed in f^* and γ . (1 p)
 - **b.** Find h^* expressed in f^* and b. (1 p)
- 8. Consider the coordinate proximal-gradient method (CPG)

Choose
$$i$$

$$x_i^{k+1} = \operatorname{prox}_{\gamma_i g_i} (x_i^k - \gamma_i (\nabla f(x^k))_i)$$
$$x_j^{k+1} = x_j^k \quad \forall j \neq i.$$

Let x^* be a fixed point of CPG, i.e. $x^k = x^* \implies x^{k+1} = x^*$, regardless of which coordinate i was chosen. Show that x^* solves the problem

$$\min f(x) + \sum_{i=1}^{n} g_i(x_i)$$

given that f and g_i are closed convex and constraint qualification hold. (1 p)

9. Consider primal problem

$$\min_{x \in \mathbb{R}^n} \|x\|_1 + |\mathbf{1}^T x|$$

and dual problem

$$\min_{y \in \mathbb{R}} \iota_{[-1,1]}(-1y) + \iota_{[-1,1]}(y)$$

where $\mathbf{1} \in \mathbb{R}^n$ is a vector of all ones. Then function $\iota_{[a,b]}$ is the indicator of the set $\{x \in \mathbb{R}^m : a \leq x \leq b\}$ where the inequality is applied element wise.

Let y^* be a solution to the dual problem and assume the primal solution x^* is unknown. Recover x^* from y^* using the primal-dual optimality conditions.
